## Dear Mr. xxxxxxx:

This letter is in regards to your driving privileges and the fact that you received an alcohol offense under the age of 18. Due to the nature of your offense, **Vanessa's Law** (Minnesota Statute 169A.55, Subd. 3), which went into effect May 5, 2004, requires you to meet additional requirements.

Here is what you will need to do to get your driving privileges back:

- Complete another 30 hours of classroom driver's education.
- Complete all requirements of the revocation as noted on your revocation notice.
- Bring proof of classroom training to an exam station and apply for an instruction permit (\$12.00) and a driver license (\$24.00). You should then fax the completed revocation requirements, the instruction permit and a driver license applications and proof of classroom completion to 651-797-1298, Attention: Driver Evaluation regarding Vanessa's Law. An instruction permit will then be issued once you turn 18 or if you already are 18; providing your revocation time is over and you have met the revocation requirements.
- It is suggested that you first check your Minnesota driving status to see if you show valid for driving on the Minnesota Instruction Permit receipt before practice driving or starting your six hours of behind-the-wheel driving lessons. The web site is <a href="www.mndriveinfo.org">www.mndriveinfo.org</a> or you may call 651-284-2000. You will also be mailed a letter of reinstatement of driving privilege.
- During the time of possessing a valid instruction permit, you must complete six hours of behind-the-wheel training and hold a valid instruction permit for at least 90 days.
- Once the 90 days is over and you have completed the behind-the-wheel training, please fax proof of completion to 651-797-1298, Attention: Driver Evaluation regarding Vanessa's Law. Your driver's license will then be processed for issuing if otherwise eligible.

While this may seem overwhelming, please know that lawmakers felt the sanctions in **Vanessa's Law** were needed to prevent future tragedies involving young drivers and alcohol. If you have further questions, please call Driver Evaluation at 651-296-2025.
