This form is used when information is printed incorrectly on a certificate of title or when alteration or erasure has occurred on the title.

1. Complete the vehicle identification information as it appears on the current title.
2. Attach this form, when completed, to the current certificate of title.
3. For a name change request, the new Driver's License number should be indicated next to owner(s) signature. If the Driver's License has not been changed, proof of the name change (certified copy) is required.
4. All sellers and buyers must sign for corrections on altered sale dates, and for corrections on odometer and damage disclosure statements.

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What is the purpose of supplying the requested information?
